FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month. With over two billion people online today, it is imperative that we protect our children from online predation. At any given moment there are an estimated 50,000 predators online looking for potential victims. 1 in 5 teens has reported that they have been sexually solicited while online. Computers are not baby sitters and nothing can replace a parent's supervision and active participation when it comes to keeping their children safe. Here are some safety tips to help keep your child's online experience safer:

Do not allow your child to have a computer with Internet access in their bedroom or any area that is private. Move it into the family room or someplace where you can easily see the activity. Set time restraints. Do not allow your child to spend hour after hour online. Check history and consider installing tracking software as well as parental controls. If your child is "wiping" the history every time, then you should find out why. Spend time with your child online. This does so many things including giving you quality time with your child. Explore together! Teach your kids that when they come across any material that makes them feel uncomfortable, scared, or confused to immediately tell you or another trusted adult. Teach your kids to never open emails from people they do not know in person. Teach kids to never reveal any personal information and to immediately tell you or a trusted adult if someone ever makes them feel uncomfortable or starts communicating in a sexually explicit manner. On social networks like Facebook, make sure the privacy settings are on to limit contact to only those on your child's "friends" list and those should be people the child actually knows in person. Make sure your child understands that anything that gets posted online will always be out there and can NEVER be completely deleted. A suggestive picture to a girlfriend or boyfriend could end up anywhere and everywhere. All pictures should be cleared by you before posting. Make sure your child understands that he or she should, under no circumstances, ever meet in person someone they met online without you being present. Thank you so much for your financial support and for living your financial commitment to your parish. We are grateful for those who generously support the parish. **We need your support** to achieve our weekly collection goal of \$6,000 per Sunday which is essential to the financial health of your parish.

OLC is facing a financial crisis. This past year many families have relocated out of Jersey City. This has adversely effected our Sunday collections. Collections are down and ParishPay contributions have dropped by 30% to an average of less than \$1,900 per week. A very important way in which you can support your parish is to enroll in ParishPay and by being more generous in the Sunday collection. To sign up, go to www.parishpay.com and follow the prompts.

For the weekend of April 16-17, 400 people attended Mass; the collection in church amounted to \$2,723. ParishPay information has not been available for several weeks, we apologize.


"I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another."



Dear Parishioners,

Thank you for your continued financial support of Our Lady of Czestochowa Parish. Your contributions to the Christmas Appeal and other previous appeals, have helped the Parish fund important projects and we appreciate your generosity.



As we celebrate Easter, the Parish Finance Committee asks parishioners to make a special contribution to help the Parish meet its "ordinary operating expenses." This is our traditional "Easter Gift Appeal."

As a Parish, we are facing significant challenges. In addition to paying for the Parish's rising expenses, the Parish was also faced with the unexpected expense of repairing the church boiler again, as well as chimney repairs and the installation of a new stainless steel liner in the chimney. There is never a good time for heating-related expenses, especially the middle of winter. We appreciated everyone's understanding during this emergency.
