Our History

Our Lady of Czestochowa Church, or OLC, was founded in 1911 to serve Polish immigrants in Jersey City. Today, OLC is growing and changing as it seeks to serve all those who now live in our neighborhood. The Church takes its name from a city in Poland that houses a cherished icon of the Blessed Virgin Mary. A copy of that icon is centrally located in our historic Church.

FROM THE PASTOR


Dear Parishioners,

This week's gospel reading is an example of learning to see beyond the obvious. When Jesus tells the people who followed Him that "... This bread is my flesh, which *I will give for the life of the world," they are confused and horrified. "They argue* among themselves, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?'" John 6:51-42 Why would anyone do this? Why would something like this be necessary?

His audience took his words literally and did not see beyond their surface meaning. Jesus was drawing a parallel between Himself and food that sustains the body. *No living thing can be preserved unless proper nourishment is received, so no soul*

could be saved but by His death. Our salvation is purchased by Christ through the breaking of his body and the shedding of His blood. The physical act of eating the communion host and drinking the communion wine does not guarantee entry into heaven. It is faith in Jesus as our Lord and Savior that will allow us to join Him in His Kingdom after death. Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we partake of Christ by faith. "... Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we tell the story of God's saving love for his people. We make memory of the redemptive, life-giving love of God that culminated in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus...." (Catholics on Call, Online Retreat 2006 Christ the Bread of Life)





JOIN A PARISH MINISTRY

COOPERATIVE (COOP) ADMISSION EXAM FOR INCOMING EIGHTH-GRADERS

The Cooperative Admissions Examination for 2015 for Eighth-grade students will be offered on Friday, No-

vember 6, 2015. The COOP is for students applying for fall 2016 admission to Catholic high schools in the Archdiocese of Newark and the Di-



ocese of Paterson. The test will be conducted at established test sites in the Archdiocese of Newark (Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Union, and Rockland counties) and the Diocese of Paterson (Passaic, Morris, and Sussex counties). The COOP is designed to measure scholastic aptitude in verbal and non-verbal abilities, and achievement in reading, mathematics, and language. Beginning September 1, you may obtain an application and handbook from a Catholic elementary or high school. You may also write to the Cooperative Admissions Examination Office at the address below. To apply online, visit the COOP web page at www.coopexam.org or call 1-888-921-2667 (888-921-COOP) weekdays between 8:30 am and 8:30 pm. The examination fee of \$60.00 will include reporting scores to three high schools of your choice. Applications and fees will be processed from September 1, 2015 through October 13, 2015.
