FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Wherever Jesus went, He granted grace, wisdom and healing. When Jesus traveled to the district of Tyre and Sidon, we expected to see more of the same. However, when the Lord is approached by a Canaanite woman whose daughter was possessed by a demon, he doesn't even acknowledge her. (His followers were no doubt relieved as they had urged Jesus to send her away for continually shouting after them.) To make matters worse, Jesus appears to insult her when He says, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel... It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." (Matthew 15:21-26) Can this be the same Jesus whom everyone was talking about? The Jesus who showed compassion for even the most lowly outcasts in society? The Jesus who healed many people? What's going on here?

Jesus chose this moment to teach His disciples a vital lesson about persistence and faith. It should be noted that during the century leading up to this incident, there was much spiritual and military conflict between the Israelites and the Canaanites. The Canaanites were gentiles and generally regarded Jews as no better than dogs. This desperate mother realizes that Jesus is not insulting her but rather, testing her faith. Is she prepared to seek and accept help from Him, though He is a lowly Jew? Her answer was "yes". The Canaanite woman recognized Jesus as the son of God and knew that He was the only one who could save her beloved daughter. Her reply to Christ that "... even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table..." is proof of this. (Matthew 15:27) The Bread of Life being offered by God is great and she would be grateful for even one crumb. Undeterred by Jesus' initial rebuff, she refuses to give up--and Jesus, after praising her great faith, heals her daughter.

It appears so often in the Gospels that faith comes easy for so many. Quite the contrary is true. This Gospel illustrates that faith never comes easy. We are often tested to see just how strong and persistent we are in faith.

BAPTISM



GATHERING TO REJOICE is the first component of our Baptism Program for those preparing for the birth of their child. You must *pre-register* for this program. GATHERING TO UNDERSTAND is the second part of our Baptism program. If you are preparing for the baptism of your child, this program is *required*. It addresses theology, the responsibilities and requirements of parents and Godparents, etc.

Please register as parishioners before attending the baptism classes. You can register in the rectory Monday through Friday from 9:30 am until 5:00 pm. The application is free and only takes a few minutes.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

Our RCIA program (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) is now beginning. This program is intended for adults who desire to become Catholic. It is also intended for adults who desire to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

the rectory. After completing the program, an unbaptized candidate will be baptized during the Easter Vigil, 2018. All others will receive their appropriate sacraments during the Easter season 2018.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

We are enrolling children for the reception of their sacraments (First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation) for 2018. Registration will take place in the rectory between 10:00 am and 4:45 pm.

When you register, we will require a copy of your child's baptismal certificate. The offering for Reconciliation and First Holy Communion is \$120. The offering for Confirmation is \$60.

If your child is receiving Confirmation in 8th grade, 7th graders must register for our two-year program. Should you have any questions, please call the rectory at 201-434-0798.

WEEKLY OFFERING



Thank you so much for your financial support and for living your financial commitment to your parish. We are grateful for those who generously support the parish. We need your support to achieve our weekly collection goal of \$6,000 per Sunday.

OLC continues to face a financial crisis. While our collections were up during the Easter Season, they have been dropping below our \$6,000 weekly goal again. Therefore, we still expect financial difficulties as we go forward. We ask a few things of you:

For the weekend of August 12/13, 330 people attended Mass. The collection in church amounted to \$2,417. ParishPay donations for the past week were \$2,156 contributing to a weekend collection of \$4,573. This is \$1,427 **below** our weekly goal of \$6,000.

If you have been away from church traveling for any reason, we encourage you to "make up" your contributions. Remember that although it is important to support your parish financially, your donation is ultimately a gift back to God for his blessings.


