## Our History

Our Lady of Czestochowa Church, or OLC, was founded in 1911 to serve Polish immigrants in Jersey City. Today, OLC is growing and changing as it seeks to serve all those who now live in our neighborhood. The Church takes its name from a city in Poland that houses a cherished icon of the Blessed Virgin Mary. A copy of that icon is centrally located in our historic Church.

## Faith Formation during 10:00 am Mass

We provide a Faith Formation program called “Children’s Liturgy of the Word” for children 2½ years of age and up during the Sunday Mass. We dismiss the children from Mass after the Opening Prayer to the church hall, returning before the Offertory. Parents are welcome to accompany their child if they wish.

Saturday 4:00 pm to 4:30 pm in the church and at other times by appointment with the pastor.

## FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Have you ever been to an “all-you-can-eat-restaurant”? Some people have no problem eating their fill at an all-you-can eat buffet. Others may be hesitant. They ask themselves whether they are having too much. They may ask if it is wrong to indulge when many go hungry, whether people notice how much I put on my plate, or wonder how many helpings I had? You went willingly, you paid, you sat at the table, it IS an all-you-can-eat restaurant, so why the hesitation to partake?

In this week’s gospel reading, the people resist Jesus’ invitation to join in His spiritual feast (though they have no trouble accepting a miraculous free meal from Him). He wants to do more than merely satiate their physical hunger. Jesus wants to invite everyone to share in God’s heavenly banquet and enjoy something infinitely more satisfying: the promise of Eternal Life. The people question whether they should accept Jesus as the “bread of life.” Perhaps they believe themselves unworthy of receiving this Grace, or don’t want to appear greedy. They may want to partake of the Lord’s offering but fear others’ reactions. Jesus invites everyone to His Father’s “table” and wants us to eat our fill any time we want without hesitation. The fish and loaves are food that sustain the body but He Himself is the food that nourishes the soul. “...I am the bread of life... This is the bread which comes down from heaven, that a man may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever...” John 6:48-51.

The invitation is given and the feast is laid out. If we go away hungry, why did that happen? What is stopping us from joining the feast? We have to make the effort to come to the table. We have to believe in the power of the Word. Everyone deserves to receive the gift of Eternal Life. We have to believe that we are worthy of partaking in the spiritual feast that He offers, one that provides hope, love and union with God.





## COOPERATIVE (COOP) ADMISSION EXAM FOR INCOMING EIGHTH-GRADERS

The Cooperative Admissions Examination for 2015 for Eighth-grade students will be offered on Friday, November 6, 2015. The COOP is for students applying for fall 2016 admission to Catholic high schools in the Archdiocese of Newark and the Diocese of Paterson. The test will be conducted at established test sites in the Archdiocese of Newark (Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Union, and Rockland counties) and the Diocese of Paterson (Passaic, Morris, and Sussex counties). The COOP is designed to measure scholastic aptitude in verbal and non-verbal abilities, and achievement in reading, mathematics, and language. Beginning September 1, you may obtain an application and handbook from a Catholic elementary or high school. You may also write to the Cooperative Admissions Examination Office at the address below. To apply online, visit the COOP web page at [www.coopexam.org](http://www.coopexam.org) or call 1-888-921-2667 (888-921-COOP) weekdays between 8:30 am and 8:30 pm. The examination fee of \$60.00 will include reporting scores to three high schools of your choice. Applications and fees will be processed from September 1, 2015 through October 13, 2015.
