FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The Feast of Christ the King was officially instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Fear and uncertainty after World War I continued. Mussolini had just seized power in Italy. Stalin had seized control of the Soviet Union from Lenin, and many of these leaders were executing Christians (and everyone else) and essentially declaring their independence from God. "...Pope Pius XI wanted to remind the Church and the world, with the institution of the Feast of Christ the King, exactly who was the true leader of nations...." (David Bennett, www.churchyear.net, Nov. 16, 2014)

Pope Pius XI wrote in his encyclical, "This kingdom is spiritual and is concerned with spiritual things...and Christ by his own action confirms it. On many occasions, when the Jews and even the Apostles wrongly supposed that the Messiah would restore the liberties and the kingdom of Israel, he repelled and denied such a suggestion. When the populace thronged around him in admiration and would have acclaimed him King, he shrank from the honor and sought safety in flight. Before the Roman magistrate he declared that his kingdom was not of this world. The gospels present this kingdom as one which men prepare to enter by penance, and cannot actually enter except by faith and by baptism, which, though an external rite, signifies and produces an interior regeneration. This kingdom is opposed to none other than to that of Satan and to the power of darkness. It demands of its subjects a spirit of detachment from riches and earthly things, and a spirit of gentleness. They must hunger and thirst after justice, and more than this, they must deny themselves and carry the cross." (*Quas Primas*, #15, 1924)

It is fitting that the feast celebrating Christ's kingship is observed right before Advent and at the end of the liturgical year, when we wait for the promised King. When Pilate asks Jesus, "So you are a king?" He answers, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." John 18:37 May everyone listen to Christ's voice and emulate Him in unconditional love, mercy and justice.

This program is designed for both Catholics and non-Catholics wishing to learn more about Catholicism. This program will offer new insights into our faith and a deeper understanding about theology and spirituality.


