## FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Bayonne Golf Club is a "Members Only" club. You may play "by invitation only, and private memberships are available for those discerning few." The club's brochure implies exclusivity and privilege, and acceptance into the club is only possible after stringent requirements are met.

Any club wanting to restrict its membership would make admission impossible for many looking to join. Many will be disappointed; those accepted would feel privileged and above the outsiders. In Mark 9:38-39 Jesus is not pleased with the disciples' claim to exclusivity, and admonishes them to focus on how



all are one who call upon His name. John and his fellow disciples have an arguably unique status. Jesus' disciples have mistakenly believed that they are part of an exclusive club where membership and special status is exclusive to the twelve. Jesus reminds them that "every least degree of sincere faith and Christian performance shall be accepted and rewarded." (The Christian Miscellany, Part I, [Edinburgh: John Johnstone, 1842], page 317) John and his companions tell of their encounter with an unnamed exorcist and how they tried to stop the man from continuing his work "... because he wasn't following them." (Mark 9:38-39) The disciples appear to be seeking approval from Jesus for their attempts to stop the exorcist because he is not of the twelve. They are surprised at His tolerance and are even more surprised at His response, "For truly I tell you, whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you bear the name of Christ will by no means lose the reward." (Mark 9:41) Jesus reminds us that helping others is more than a good deed when it is performed in His name and these kindnesses are rewarded and sanctified. God doesn't want there to be any obstacles between Him and us. The reading continues with how to deal with temptation. "...If any of you put a stumbling block before the little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you... to be thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off..." (Mark 9:43-43) We are exhorted to remove all stumbling blocks on our path to Enlightenment (not to literally amputate offending limbs but rather, to separate ourselves from any obstacles that might prevent us keep us from joining Him in His Kingdom). The kingdom of Heaven is the only club that is open to all, all you need for membership is to ask for admittance. There is no exclusivity in Jesus.

#### SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

We are now enrolling children for the reception of their sacraments (First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation) for 2016. Registration will take place in the



rectory between 10:00 am and 4:45 pm. When you register, we will require a copy of your child's baptismal certificate. The offering for Reconciliation and First Holy Communion is \$120. The offering for Confirmation is \$60.

If your child is receiving Confirmation in 8<sup>th</sup> grade, 7<sup>th</sup> graders must register for our two-year program. Should you have any questions about either program,

We plan to begin classes in early October. Registration must be completed before October to insure that we purchased sufficient educational materials for all the children. We do not want children going without their supplies while in

class. To compensate for late registrations, we will require a "late registration" fee.

### **LECTURE SERIES**

# COOPERATIVE (COOP) ADMISSION EXAM FOR INCOMING EIGHTH-GRADERS

The Cooperative Admissions Examination for 2015 for Eighth-grade students will be offered on Friday, November 6, 2015. The COOP is for students applying for fall 2016 admission to Catholic high schools in the Archdiocese of Newark and the Diocese of Paterson. The test will be conducted at established test sites in the Archdiocese of Newark (Bergen, Essex, Hudson,

Union, and Rockland counties) and the Diocese of Paterson (Passaic, Morris, and Sussex counties). COOP is designed to meas-

ure scholastic aptitude in verbal and non-verbal abilities, and achievement in reading, mathematics, and language. Beginning September 1, you may obtain an application and handbook from a Catholic elementary or high school. You may also write to the Cooperative Admissions Examination Office at the address below. To apply online, visit the COOP web page at www.coopexam.org or call 1-888-921-2667 (888-921-COOP) weekdays between 8:30 am and 8:30 pm. The examination fee of \$60.00 will include reporting scores to three high schools of your choice. Applications and fees will be processed from September 1, 2015 through October 13, 2015.
