FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

It is so easy to get wrapped up in our own busyness and concerned about the elements of life with which we are daily confronted. As always, this is where the Lord confronts us and shakes us out of our comfort zone. "Do not work for food that perishes." All the food that we eat will perish, so here food is a synonym for that which gives strength. Some things that provide us with strength will, in time, make us weak, other things that give strength have a more lasting impact and fortify us for later.

Think about spending time working out, or fixing your hair. When you stop working out for an extended period, all the strength you had attained is gone, and there may even be some tearing and scarring of your muscles that you now have to deal with. Likewise, I think of a bride who has a team come to do her makupe and hair on her wedding day... and the next day there is no lasting impact.

Now when we pray, learn elements of the faith or lives of the saints and sacrifice weekly to get to Mass, we instantly feel better about ourselves. When we are active with opportunities that exist at the parish, conversations change in our families and peace settles in our hearts. We realize in a substantial way that we are a part of something much bigger and more important than ourselves.

In time, every prayer we say and Mass we attend is held in the heart of Jesus. They not only strengthen us in the moment but continue into eternity. If I can take a small liberty with the Gospel today, I would say it's ok to work for food that perishes, we all need strength now, but put forth at least that same effort for the food that endures to eternal life.

It is also a devotional practice whereby we keep alive the memory of our loved ones. Through this practice, we can maintain that loving bond between ourselves and those whom we love. A Mass can be offered on the anniversary of death or on a person's birthday, or at any time. You may also have a Mass celebrated for someone who is ill, in thanksgiving and for special intentions for family and/or friends.

HELP FOR MAGNIFICAT HOME AND MARY'S PLACE





MARRIAGE PREPARATION PROGRAMS

A couple may not register for marriage preparation programs until they have met with the priest/deacon preparing them for the Sacrament of Matrimony. Completion of both programs is mandatory.
