FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish family,

I once asked a friend why he was always putting people down or trying to make them feel small. His answer to me was, “blowing out your candle, makes mine brighter”. This was one of the most painful lines that I have ever heard, so much so, over 20 years later, it continues to echo in my ear. Envy has been defined as the consuming desire to have everybody else as unsuccessful as you are, and this is a natural human reaction that we need to be vigilant against. It is easy to constantly compare ourselves to others and often come up short in our own eyes. This seems to be exacerbated by the different social profiles where we post our life and snoop on our friends.

Today's scripture readings offer us food for thought on the subject of envy. In a strange twist, we see the wicked in the passage from Wisdom are honest with themselves about their motives, attacking the just; this is envy. The just one, who resembles the Suffering Servant of last Sunday's first reading, and is foreshadowing Jesus, is hated, because the just one is a living reproach and a source of discomfort to the wicked who want to believe that their selfish way of life has no consequences.

James sees envy as the root of much of the evil and disorder caused by humans and suffered by humans. Envy causes dissension in and among individuals, groups, and nations. It leads us to forget **gratitude** for the many blessings we do have. It leads us to strive to 'Keep up with the Joneses' no matter what the cost to inner peace.

Jesus is teaching his disciples a reversal of the values which are the result of envy. They will not understand until they witness his death, resurrection and the coming of the Spirit. To truly be great in the eyes of Jesus, He tells His disciples to spend themselves in the service of others.


