Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord – April 14, 2019

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

As Palm Sunday approaches, we stand at the threshold of Holy Week, the week in which we commemorate the most profound mysteries of life and death, of God and man, of love and sin.

We've been preparing for forty days to step into Holy Week, reminding ourselves that by doing so, we step into the new life won for us by Christ...at a high cost.

Today's celebration is bittersweet. It is joyful and sorrowful at the same time. We celebrate the Lord's entrance into Jerusalem as the cries of His disciples acclaim Him as king. Jesus, who accepts the hosannas of the crowd, knows full well that they will soon be followed by: "Crucify him!"

It is not some other Jesus, but the same Jesus who entered Jerusalem amidst the waving of palm branches who was nailed to the cross and died between two criminals. We have no other Lord but him: Jesus, the humble King of justice, mercy, and peace.

He had spoken clearly of this to His disciples: "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me" (Mt. 16:24). Jesus never promised honor or success.


The Gospels make this clear. Jesus had always warned His friends that this was to be His path, and that the final victory would be achieved through His passion and cross. All this holds true for us, too, as we ask for the grace to follow Jesus faithfully, not only in words but in deeds. We also need to pray for the patience to carry our own cross, not to refuse it or set it aside, but rather to take it up and carry it daily.

Now we turn our faces to Him asking for the grace to understand some element of this mystery, as we welcome Him into the home of our hearts and carry our cross for His glory and honor.

OLC EASTER GIFT APPEAL



The Easter Gift Appeal is a long-standing tradition at OLC in which we ask parishioners to make their offering at Easter a special one by taking humble pride in being good stewards of our parish and being

generous in response to the Appeal.

The Easter Gift Appeal is dedicated to shoring up the parish operating account that strains under the financial stress of unavoidable increases in normal operating expenses, including: utilities and supplies, maintenance, insurance, compensation, and—just as in our personal lives—the occasional unanticipated (and not budgeted) expenses that always seem to crop up.

The effect of lost income from the convent is still being felt, and will be for the foreseeable future. However, the operating account remains in the black for the immediate future, largely thanks to your generosity in meeting last year's \$30,000 Easter Gift goal. Thank you again!

Our goal for this Easter is to raise \$35,000; just slightly higher than last year and truly needed. This goal is achievable if all those who participated last year made a sacrificial increase in their Easter gift by just 10%, and if those who are new to the parish or, for whatever reason, did not participate last year do so this year.

The suggested Easter gift is \$200. This is not a floor or a ceiling. Your Easter gift depends on what your conscience dictates and your means allow. Please prayerfully consider your participation in this year's Easter Appeal.



June 2, 2019 3:00 pm 5 & 25 years (All counties)


