FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

A large part of being a priest is celebrating weddings. And while some brides and grooms can be excessively focused on the “big day” and the minute details involved, months and sometimes years of preparation go into helping them to focus on the vows they will make, along with spending their lives together, forever.

An essential aspect of marriage that Jesus explains in today’s Gospel is that after we die, marriage no longer exists. Marriage vows don’t transcend death – in fact, the vows themselves only ask for a lifetime commitment, “until death do us part.”

In an earlier part of the Gospel, Jesus blessed marriage and elevated this critical institution to the level of a Sacrament, enabling us to sanctify our families for a higher purpose than anything on Earth. In marriage then, the bride and groom are saying that they have found the person that God placed on Earth to help them find the way to Heaven. This is why we must keep the vows we make to stay married, where feasible, all the days of lives.

When we understand marriage, not only as an earthly institution but also our vehicle to the afterlife, it makes love, patience, kindness, and sacrifice more feasible. When prayer and a commitment to a Sacramental life is a regular part of your family, it is easy to see how this works, since there is no other place that you can truly be home away from Heaven.

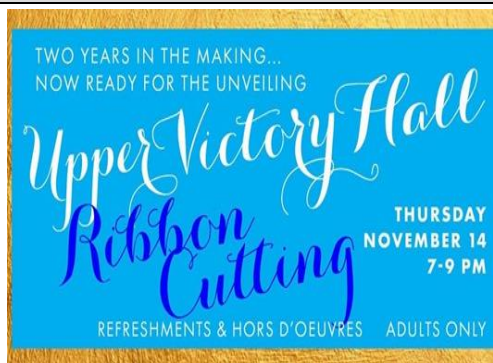

- 3. Loose cash and checks** - These are always appreciated and accepted without any qualification.
- 4. Venmo** - for those visiting our parish or for those who forgot their donation at home, we accept Venmo. Our handle is *OLCJC*. Feel free to include a prayer request or statement with something you are grateful for along with your donation.

WEEKLY OFFERING

For the weekend of October 26/27, **545** people attended Mass. The collection in church amounted to **\$3,493**. WeShare/Parish Giving donations were **\$2,064.20** and Venmo donations were **\$60**, contributing to a weekend collection of **\$5,617.20**.

If you are engaged to be married and desire the blessing of God on your union, you must first contact the parish. Ideally, this should be done at least one year in advance of your wedding. A couple may not register for marriage preparation programs until they have met with the priest/deacon preparing them for the Sacrament of Matrimony.
